
Mark your calendars! The annual Delano Business Expo will be held on Saturday, May 16th from 9am-1pm.

Minutes of the February 25th, 2020 Meeting

35 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by President Tom Delaney

Secretary's report - minutes of the January 28, 2020 meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Treasurers report - debits \$6417.02; credits \$5842.25; checking balance \$71,804.73.

New members - There was one new member at the meeting that introduced himself.

Gravel mining/Ram Excavating -Tom Delaney and Mark Bauman talked to Wright County Planning and Zoning because Ram received another request to comply with three more conditions on the EAW. Two conditions were easy to satisfy, the third requires having to do core samples in an area of the property to determine if there is lead in the soil. They also want the club to have a plan on the use of the topsoil when excavated (that it will be stockpiled in a location and reused in a berm for the trap range, and that it will not be leaving the site). The club will be looking for someone to do the boring. Ram is getting frustrated with the process. Tom will be meeting with them in the next 2-3 weeks to see what they are going to do.

Trap range - Plans for the structure and range layout have been done. Construction on the parking area and shooting area will start this year. The club will be looking for excavators, electricians, etc. for the work.

Building and Grounds - There will be a Building and Grounds meeting tonight. We will try to break into two committees. One to help Mark with the new property and trap range and another to handle the existing club grounds.

Tom Delaney changed the locks on the trap shack. The deadbolt would not engage so they had to break in.

Membership - 60 members did not

renew their membership. The club has 453 paid members.

There was an Executive Board meeting in January after the regular meeting. Items discussed were the dog park, changes to the elections - the president, Secretary and Treasurer need to be re-elected every year. Vice Presidents would no longer be moved up - and an idea for member and guest night which would be an open night at the club for activities.

Trap League - Winter trap league has two weeks left to shoot.

Fourth of July - The committee has met a few times already. They are planning not to spend as much on entertainment this year. The celebration will be July 1-4. The club will staff the bingo stand every day and the milk shake booth on July 2nd and July 4th.

The club joined the Delano Chamber of Commerce.

GOCRA & MNGOPAC - The same bills as last year - Red Flag and Universal Background checks - are coming up again. There are hearings on them in the house on Thursday, they probably won't go through the senate. Wednesday March 4th is gun owners lobby day at the Capitol. It is an opportunity to talk to the representatives in person. April 18th is rally day at the Capitol. The club will try to get a bus to go down to the Capitol on this day.

Reservations - the reservation for Park Sportsmen's Club to use the range for their DNR safety class was approved.

Summer Raffle - raffle tickets are at the printers now. Prizes are a Beretta 9MM or \$500 for first, \$250 for second and \$100 for third.

Eric and Linda Lindstrom appreciated the offer to use the club for a benefit, but they will not be doing one at this time.

DEA wanted to change the terms of when they use the range for training

this year. In the past it was eight days throughout the year. As a result they may not be using the range this year. A motion was made and passed that if they change the terms, the club would not allow them to use the range.

Patches - The Club is developing a jacket patch for our lifetime member and the 70 or so honorary members we have would also get the patch. The design of the patch is nearly done - All Season Sports in Delano is helping the club with the patch.

All Season Sports will be putting together pricing on a gun for the members only raffle.

The Cub Scouts are turning 70 years old this year. There will be a celebration at the intermediate school in Delano on Saturday from 1-4 PM. Anybody who was a Cub Scout is welcome to come.

Larry Lindborg is looking for volunteers to cut out patterns for woodduck and bluebird houses. Bird house building day will be April 11th.

Tree order forms are available for those interested in ordering trees. Get your order in as soon as possible to insure availability.

Firearms Safety - the clubs firearms safety class sign up will be on March 9th.

Summer Camp - the club still has a few spots left for kids to go to summer camp. If you know any kids from 12-16 years old that are interested, let the club know.

February lunch was provided by Coborns. March will be provided by Rick Georges and Corcoran Meat Locker.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:54 PM.

RANGE RULES

- 1. Your ID card must be visibly worn when on the range.
- 2. A maximum of 2 guests are allowed with a member on the range.
- 3. Use paper targets only! No cans, glass or other items.
- 4. Paintball guns are not allowed om the range.
- 5. Do NOT attach targets to backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting except for organized events.
- Be sure bullets impact the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines, 25, 50 or 100 yard lines.
- 10. The 50 yard target must be moved off the range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot at anything on the ground.
- Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, pick up shell casings. Leave the area clean and ready for use by the next member.
- Check unknown persons for membership cards. Non-members are not allowed to use the range unless accompanied by a member.
- 15. Do a safety check down range before firing.
- 16. The use of fully automatic weapons is FORBIDDEN on the range.
- 17. The gate is to be kept LOCKED at all times.

Tree Program participants,

Welcome or welcome back to those that are new and those that have planted for years. We have a good selection again this year for you to choose from. Whether you have a small backyard or acreage, a windbreak or wildlife area, we have something for you.

Last year was the first year that we offered a *Native Plant Kit* and they were popular. They are a great enhancement for any landscape, pollinator garden or natural area. This gives some options for those that may have planted themselves out of room with trees and shrubs over the years. Note that this year each kit is six species in six 6-packs (1 whole flat). The *Native Seed Mix* was also offered as another option for those that wanted to diversify and add a different habitat to their landscape. The birds and pollinators will surely thank you for your efforts. We are offering different options for plants and seed this year. More info on these offerings is included and on our webpage: *wrightswcd.org*

As you may have noticed the past few years, we have been focusing on offering trees and shrubs that are native to Minnesota or the Midwest. Native species are adapted to our climate, weather and pests, thus making them more hardy long term, more successful and more beneficial to our wildlife and pollinators. Non-native species such as Tartarian honeysuckle and Amur maple have been found to be invasive and thus won't be offered. Some species such as Colorado spruce, do not do well long term with our humid climate. Nevertheless, we still offer a few hardy, introduced species such as Common lilac and select evergreens, that have proven popular over the years. We encourage you this year to take some time to look beyond the species that you are familiar with and find a native alternative that will provide you with more habitat and plant diversity and likely a better outcome down the road. Who knows, you may even find a new favorite.

We are happy to be able to offer Tree Pro tree tubes this year. Many have asked in the past about tubes and now, through cooperation with the manufacturer, we are able to offer tubes and stakes shipped directly to your door. Tubes are great for protecting against herbivory from, deer, rabbits, voles etc. They also act as protection from the elements and a personal greenhouse for your trees. A 60" tube, comes with 3 zip-ties to secure them to stakes. Treated pine wood stakes are also available and sold separately. Some may prefer to purchase metal or fiberglass stakes or make their own from conduit or rebar. Bird nets are available to top tubes if requested on the order form. An installation video is available online at *treepro.com/ease-of-installation* or a link is posted to our webpage.

Tubes must be ordered and paid for separately from trees through the SWCD. Payment must be included with the order to allow for shipping and processing. Tubes and stakes will come directly to you after order and payment is received by the **SWCD**. Order forms and payment by check can be mailed to the SWCD. The SWCD will **NOT** handle any inventory of tubes or stakes.
