Gun Sales Soaring

Firearm sales soared in January after the assault on the U.S. Capitol and the arrival of a new administration that favors tighter gun restrictions.

More than 2 million firearms were bought in January, according to the Washington Post's analysis of federal gun background-check data. That is an 80% year-over-year spike and the third-highest one-month total on record.

While Western Michigan University's Thomas M. Cooley Law School (also on the board of the Michigan Coalition for Responsible Gun Owners) said he heard many firearm owners were buying firearms as an investment, like a precious metal.

More common, he said are reports of first-time buyers who said they no longer trust police departments to protect them, especially after some agencies were overwhelmed by protestors during the summer.

It's common for gun sales to jump when a Democrat takes over the White House. In January 2009, when Barak Obama was inaugurated for his first term, a record 1.2 million background checks were completed. In January 2017, when Trump was inaugurated, there was a 20% drop in checks from 2016.

Minutes of January 26th Meeting

Treasurers report - debits \$6283.60; credits \$10,930.00; checking balance \$90,588.33

Election of Officers were held - Tom Delaney was nominated for President for another year, Dan Kittok was nominated for secretary for another year and Joe Kittok was nominated for treasurer for another year. All nominations passed. Cal Brandt stepped aside as second vice president, Bert Neuenschwander moves up to second vice president, Mike Larison was nominated and elected for third vice president.

Trap range update - There has been no contact from Ram lately. There are a couple interested contractors to do the dirt work. Mark Bauman will have a more detailed update at the next meeting. We want to start this spring. Brad Spencer updated the clubs application for a matching fund from the DNR for the construction of the trap range. The application was accepted but Brad has not yet received the agreement. The matching fund is for \$25,000.

Improvements for the 25 yard range will start in the spring.

Joe Kittok has been working on updating the electrical outlets in the farm house.

The club patches for honorary/life members have been sent out. Tom Delaney donated them to the club. There are some oversize patches that were made by mistake. A motion was made and passed to offer All Season Sports \$300 for the oversize patches and have the trap shooting kids use them.

The gun show was a success. It was a small show but people had a blast. Tom will work on getting another one set up for April or May.

Building and Grounds committee will probably meet in March

Membership - 88% of the membership has paid their dues for 2021

Fourth of July - There have been several planning meetings to decide how big of a celebration to have. There will be a meeting again in a couple weeks to decide.

Winter Trap League started the first week of January, it has been going good. They will be shooting 8 weeks.

FIREARMS SAFETY TRAINING COURSE

Location: Delano Sportsman's Club

Course is 4 weeks in length – held Tuesday and Thursday evenings except for March 29th which is on a Monday.

Class Dates and Times are as follows:

March 16 & 18 7-9pm

March 23 & 25 7-9pm

March 29 & April 1 7-9pm

April 6 & April 8 7-9pm

April 10 Field Day 7am- 12 noon

Students must be 11 years old by class start date. Adults are welcome and encouraged to take this course.

A parent or guardian is required to attend the first class on March 16th.

There is no course fee.

No firearms or ammunition are to be brought to classes by students. A firearm of some type (i.e., rifle, shotgun, BB gun, etc.... but not pistol) will be needed for the Field Day and each student is encouraged to bring their own. If student cannot bring a firearm, one will be provided to use on Field Day. Do not bring ammunition to Field Day, the instructors will provide ammunition for students .22 rifles.

Only .22 caliber will be permitted for firing on Field Day.

Field Day will be held rain or shine. Students should dress accordingly.

This Firearms Safety Training Course will cover hunter responsibility, firearm handling, marksmanship, wildlife identification, game management, conservation, game care, outdoor survival, water safety, and first aid awareness.

The class size will be limited due to COVID restrictions so all students must register prior to start of class.

Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 2 guests per member are allowed.
- 3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards.
- 10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a **Safety Check** before firing
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
