Minutes of the October 25th Meeting

33 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by President Tom Delaney

Secretary's report - Minutes of the September 27, 2022 meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Treasurers report - debits \$10,678.53; credits \$7073.00 checking balance \$96,754.32.

New members - four new members introduced themselves

Trap range update - Mark Bauman is having a hard time finding someone to do the concrete work. John Fritz has a person lined up to look at it this week.

Members only raffle - \$830.00 has been collected so far. There will be two guns to pick from: a Berreta shotgun and a Winchester 6.5 Creedmore with scope. The guns were purchased from club member Greg Fedeli of Fenex Firearms.

Trapshooting - Summer league is over. Winter league starts Thursday, December 1st.

25 Yard Range - The portable targets continue to get shot up. It is the responsibility of all members to clean up the range after they use it and to center their targets.

Farm property - the access road by the farm will need to be widened for equipment coming in to move dirt.

Newsletter - the club is spending \$450.00 a month to send out printed newsletters. If you are able to convert to an emailed newsletter, please do.

Membership - 10% of the membership is paid up for 2023. Dues are now due for 2023.

Federal Judges Expand Gun Rights

Federal judges have struck down gun restrictions in the months since a Supreme Court decision that expanded Second Amendment rights and experts say there is likely more to come.

A judge in West Virginia this month cited the Supreme Court case when he struck down a federal law that required guns to have serial numbers. So did a judge in Texas who ruled last month that people under criminal indictments can still possess guns, and a judge who this month tossed New York's prohibitions on carrying concealed firearms in Times Square, summer camps, subways and theaters.

More than a dozen other challenges to gun control laws are pending in federal courts which legal experts say could leave holes in efforts to curb gun violence.

And with longstanding partisan divisions in Congress over gun control bills, the high court will likely have the final say over the fate of national rules.

Judges are now grappling with how to apply the Supreme Court's decision from June, which has "led to some pretty bizarre results," according to Andrew Willinger, executive director of the Center for Firearms Law at Duke University.

...Still, a federal judge in California has relied on the Supreme Court decision to uphold a San Jose law that requires liability insurance for gun owners.

...Gun rights advocates have filed other lawsuits to challenge gun laws, such as a ban on guns on the Metro in Washington, a ban on home-made guns in San Diego, or a ban on assault weapons in Colorado.

No monthly club meeting in December

Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 2 guests per member are allowed.
- 3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards.
- 10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a **Safety Check** before firing
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
