Volunteer Credit-What Counts?

Members who volunteer to support the club receive reduced dues of \$50 for the next year. So, what counts?

Minutes of the January 30th Meeting

33 members present - the meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by President Tom Delaney

Secretary's report - Minutes of the November 28, 2023 meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Treasurers report - debits \$10,616.40; credits \$17,177.50; checking balance \$30,575.10 - was approved

New members: two new members introduced themselves.

Elections of officers were held - Mike Larison was voted in as President, Joe Kittok was voted in as Treasurer, Dan Kittok was voted in as Secretary, Gene Hanson was voted in as Third Vice President and Tom Delaney was voted in as Public Relations liaison.

Trap range update - The power is in and the lights are on order. We hope to get the lights in yet this winter. The club is looking for a building/temporary work site trailer to operate out of. Keep your eyes open for a suitable structure. The club was approved for the \$25,000 grant from the DNR.

XCEL Energy lease - Everything has been cleared off the property except for the grates. XCEL still has to do restoration of the property as a condition of the lease. They may need to extend the lease?

Member raffle - The members only raffle has collected \$5130.00. The winner of the Kimber 1911 is David Van Dongen

Membership - 85% of the membership has paid their dues so far.

Executive Board - There was an Executive Board meeting at 6:30 pm before the regular meeting to discuss the new public relations position. This position will take phone calls, attend meetings, and assist in events on behalf of the club.

Public Relations Position - As recommended by the Executive Board a motion was made and passed to approve the addition of a Public Relations position.

Building and Grounds - The club had issues with kids driving into the property where the new range is. The access has since been roped off. Much of the farm was cleaned up in December. Joe Kittok thanks everyone that helped out.

Newsletter - The club is looking for more help in producing the newsletter. If you want to help out contact Bob Ball or Donna Stundahl

Range and Clubhouse reservations - Reservations for the police departments, gun safety, trap shooting and Women's league were all approved.

New Sign - The cost of a 6' X 10' sign for the club house is

\$1500. A motion was made and passed to go with another 4' X 8' sign.

4th of July - The committee will be meeting next week. The committee is trying to add new things - frisbee golf, pickle ball, archery and trapshooting to keep things fresh.

Women's League - There is an event coming up on Saturday. The league is up to two events a month. There has been a lot of positive feedback regarding the league from the participants. Shooters are learning a lot and their shooting has improved. The club approved adding Gene Hanson to the insurance policy for his help with the league.

GOCRA/MNGOPAC Legislative updates - There will be a rally at the capital on April 27th. The club will try to set up a bus again to go down to it.

Muzzleloader interest - Club member Joe Bergeron will coordinate training and events in 2024. Dates are forthcoming.

Christmas Party - The Clubs potluck Christmas Party was well attended again this year

Gun Show - The club's annual gun show had a moderate turnout. Thirty people came through.

Mike Wolf sold the brass that was collected on the range. The club received \$1500.25.

Bird house building - The date is set for March 27th for bluebird and wood duck house building. Thirty of each will be built.

The club will be sending six kids to camp again this year. The total cost of \$3000.00 was approved.

West Hennepin police is looking for a few more people to attend its next academy. The academy is held on Thursday nights for eight weeks.

Thank you to the Lucky Fives trap team for providing lunch for the meeting. Coborns will provide lunch for the February meeting. March through November are open for lunch volunteers.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:46 PM.

Range Rules:

- 1. You must wear your ID card when on the range.
- 2. Maximum of 2 guests per member are allowed.
- 3. Use paper targets only (no cans, glass, plinking).
- 4. No Paintball guns
- 5. Do not attach targets to the backstop posts.
- 6. No trap shooting; except organized events.
- 7. Be sure bullets are hitting the backstops.
- 8. Do not dig in the backstops.
- 9. All firing must be done from the firing lines at 25, 50 & 100 yards.
- 10. Move the 50-yard target off range when not in use.
- 11. No intermediate targets between established firing lines.
- 12. Do not shoot anything on the ground.
- 13. Pick up your trash, remove targets from backstops, & pick up casings. Leave the area clean & ready for the next member.
- 14. Check unknown people for membership cards.
- 15. Do a **Safety Check** before firing
- 16. Fully automatic weapons are forbidden
- 17. The gate is to be kept locked at all times.
