## Minutes of the February 25th, 2014 Meeting

18 members present - the meeting called to order by First Vice President Larry Lindborg at 7:02 PM

Secretary's Report - Minutes of the January 28, 2014 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Treasurers Report - Opening balance in the checking account \$26,537.70; debits \$9464.98; credits \$5514.75; checking balance \$22,587.47; balance in all accounts \$27587.47. Treasurers report was approved and filed.

### Committee Reports

Tom Delaney reported that there was a Building and Grounds Committee meeting, items discussed were: The 25 yard range has some posts that need to be replaced, they will be working on getting camera's set up on the 25 yard range and will also run a wire for an electric outlet. Silhouette targets were discussed, no decision has been made but research will be done to see if there are ways to put up barriers so the targets are not visible from the road. A letter will be put in the newsletter outlining the proper procedure of reporting misbehavior on the range.

Mike Speckle updated the club on the last Fourth of July Committee meeting. The celebration will be held on July 2, 3, 4 and 5. The parade will be on the 4th with the fireworks on the 5th. On the fourth there will be a special section with Minnesota craft beers, craft beers will also be available in the beer stand. There will be a bean bag tournament again this year. The parade route will stay the same as last year. The club is responsible for the bingo stand and the milk shake booth.

Tom Delaney said that the E-mailing of the newsletters is going well. Jan Kittok commented that 285 newsletters were mailed out last month. Printing cost, folding cost and postage needed have all gone down. The club should be able to get down to half of what it used to cost.

Larry Linborg had tree order forms and said they will be included in next month's newsletter. Send the completed forms to Larry Linborg or the Wright Soil and Water District. Members will

pay full price for trees this year. Tree cost is \$1.05 each and need to be ordered in packs of 25.

Larry Linborg has six people that have signed up to help cut out pieces for the wood duck and blue bird houses. Assembly day is March 22nd starting at 9:00 AM.

The Delano Expo is on April 12th - volunteers are needed for the day to set up and man the booth.

It was reported that we lost 105 members this past year which is typical. New members are still signing up though.

Applications for six students have been filled out and sent in for Forkhorn Camp or long Lake Conservation Camp. There are a couple people on the list already for next year.

Dan MacDonald gave an update on GOCRA - Gun Owners Civil Rights Alliance. The legislature is back in session. If you give GOCRA your e-mail address they will send you alerts on what is being discussed regarding gun rights, alerts to talk to your legislator and alerts to show up on certain days. They need our help.

### New Business

The Wright County Fair will be held July 30 - August 3. Dick Nordling is in charge of the air gun booth and will need volunteers to help man the booth.

The club's 2014 raffle will start soon. A motion was made and approved to have a \$500 gas card, a \$250 grocery card and a \$100 gift certificate to All Season Sports as prizes. The club will need to use the permit from the city of Delano and decide on a location to do the drawing in September.

A Sig Sauer stainless five inch .45 has been purchased for the members only gun raffle to be held in January of 2015. The gun will be at the March meeting for people to see.

Larry Lindborg read the club's mail and correspondence from - the NRA 3GE guidebook, a Happy New Year card from Budget Printing, and a Minnesota Conservation Federation Walk on the

Wild side newsletter. The Minnesota Conservation Federation is also looking for donations to help provide the newsletter to schools.

## Advanced Archery DNR Training Offered- April

We will be holding a DNR Advanced Archery Class at the Clubhouse on April 26th, from 7am-5pm.

According to the MN DNR: *"Any person who wishes to bow hunt in the following states is required to have a Bow Hunter Education Certificate: Alaska, Connecticut, Idaho, Kansas, Louisiana, Maine, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island, South Dakota and Vermont. Canadian Provinces include New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Quebec. If you are planning in out-state hunt, please check that state's requirements well in advance of your trip."*

The class is limited to 25, and is also listed as open on the DNR web site.
